I love Spring. Flowers bloom. Birds sing. I can spend more time outside walking. Walking has become a priority for me. Tracking my steps daily gives me a sense of accomplishment when I am active and a sense of urgency if I am falling short of my daily steps. The question that comes to my mind is this. How do we measure our steps in our spiritual life?

Our Easter celebration continues into April (no foolin'). I think of the two disciples on their walk to the city of Emmaus. As often happened in biblical times, everyone walked together in a group. This ensured their safety. It offered company for the journey. Fellowship is a sweet byproduct of walking and talking with others on your journey.

We need these same things in our lives. To walk together. The best way to do that is to be in church. No, really! Think about it – if everyone would show up in church EVERY Sunday, then we would have well over 100 in church consistently. It would look like Easter Sunday year-round. If we invited and brought our family and friends with us, what would church look like?

The problem is, we don't always walk with each other. We separate from each other and from the congregation from time to time. We fail to talk during the week about spiritual things. We fall away and fail to track our spiritual steps. We stray into dangerous territory with no one to come along beside us and join us on our journey.

As pastor at Door Village UMC, I am tasked with leading the congregation to walk closely with each other and with the Lord. My goal is to help everyone connect. Not only on Sunday mornings, but during the week. It is not enough to simply be "Sunday Christians" only. One way we could connect with the Lord and each other is by viewing our weekly Wednesday online services. The easy part is that it is... online. You don't have to get in your car. You don't have to come to the church building. Just open your phone or sit at your computer when it is convenient for you. If you don't have access, then connect with someone who does. Get together and watch together. Walk with each other on your faith journey. Both Sundays and Wednesdays. Invite someone to join you as you attend or watch church.

Project History and Highlights of Our Trustee Committee

Sitting on the Administrative Board for many years and hearing the reports from the Trustee Committee about the routine maintenance and necessary repairs connected to keeping the church and parsonage functioning properly, it never ceased to amaze me just how extensive the list of projects really is. It was impressive just to hear about the everyday projects that got fixed or replaced, but then when I heard about all the upgrading and major projects in addition to the routine tasks I was more than amazed. Here is a list Trustee Bob Wiltfong shared with me of projects completed in the past few years:

- Parsonage completely rewired in 2010.
- Failing lighting system replaced throughout the entire building with energy efficient light fixtures, including the emergency exit signs and office ceiling lights.
- New furnace and air conditioning in parsonage in 2020.
- Reupholstering of all church pews approximately two years ago.
- Changed locks on all the doors.
- Sound booth completely replaced and upgraded.
- Updated all bathrooms, faucets and door handles throughout the building to meet handicap accessible requirements.
- Painting of the parsonage deck and porch last fall.

All that listed above is in addition to the annual and biannual federal and local government-required tasks to meet the requirements of Homeland Security, IDEM, and County Fire and Health Departments. We pay for inspections and permits and schedule elevator inspections, boiler inspections, water testing, parsonage air quality inspections, fire extinguisher inspections and recharging, fire alarm and exit light system inspections, and check AED defibrillator status and functionality.

Now add assuring all insurance premiums are paid (and seeking the best premiums and service for the money), provisions for trash pickup (a challenge to find the best service/value for the money that Sue has been chasing for months), snow removal, mowing, and scheduling of spring church and grounds cleanup. All of these are arranged for and then need properly completed.

Many projects are yet to be completed such as altar lighting (estimated cost \$4,000), parking lot repaving (estimated cost \$25,000), eventual roof replacement (estimated cost \$25,000+), and the trustees will schedule fund raisers to pay for those upcoming projects.

The above is more than impressive to me, and I would venture a guess it is likely to be quite surprising to many of you. I know it is not all inclusive because I know of several items that are not on the above list. In conclusion, if you happen to be talking to any of the trustees - Committee Chair Susan Kaiser, Bob Wiltfong, Neil Westphal, Paul Martin, John Langford, and Mike Martin - shake their hand, thank them, and tell them you appreciate their work. You'll have to stand behind me, because I'm going to be first in line to thank them. In my humble opinion, our church has a good thing going with this team, and we are blessed.




