I was doing a little reading in my bible and then it happened. I should say, it always happens. Something there on the page grabbed hold of my heart. At first it grabbed my attention. Something I have read hundreds of times. The feeding of the 5000 with 5 loaves and 2 fish. I usually focus on the willingness of the little boy to give up his lunch because someone asked him to help. That makes for a powerful sermon. I like to talk about how Jesus had compassion for those who were ill and needed healing. How this caused so many to follow Jesus wherever he went. How large crowds formed anytime he stopped, even for a moment.

It was the end of a long day. Jesus was finished with his teaching for that day. He went off to a secluded place, to rest, to get away, to regroup, and to recharge. The crowds were relentless. So, he stops on a secluded hillside. The disciples ask him to send the people into the villages to buy themselves some food. It is then that Jesus said something that caught my eye. It grabbed my attention. It stopped me in my tracks.

Jesus replied, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." ~ Matthew 14:16

How many times do we say to Jesus, "You have to do something!", only to find out, he says to us: "You give them something to eat". What I have come to know is this: It is in those moments that we feel so strongly that something needs to be done, it is then that the Lord is encouraging us to do something. And here's the thing. If we respond even if it looks unlikely or undoable - it is the Lord who will multiply the loaves and fish. We still need to pass the baskets full of bread. We need to handout what fish we gather. But in the Lord's hands, needs are met. Jesus lifts the humble gift to heaven, gives thanks to God, the Father. Then the miracle begins. So, next time you ask the Lord to intervene and do something, be ready yourself to step up and be the instrument of His Grace and Provision.

I will leave you with the words of St. Francis of Assisi:






