

One of the greatest challenges I face at Door Village UMC is how to get everyone engaged in ongoing nurturing, learning, and growing in faith through adult education. To help get the job done, I asked the nominations committee to create a new position for the church. I asked for an Adult Sunday School Coordinator. After careful consideration, Lana Fenstermaker agreed to take the position.

Together, we are working towards some new ways to engage in Adult Christian Education for our church. The old model of eight chairs around an eight-foot table on a Sunday morning is not sufficient to get the job done. We do have a Sunday morning class at 9 am that I would like to challenge you to attend. Come once. Come twice. Commit to coming during the month of June.

In addition to our Sunday morning class, we also offer a Tuesday evening class that meets at 6 pm at the church. Our Tuesday night group is currently looking at new materials to use this summer.

All I am saying is, commit to doing some form of adult Christian education – maybe on your own, or with a group of friends.

In an effort to expand what we do for Christian education, we looked into new ways to engage in Christian growth. The first idea we found is on Facebook. It is a page called **God Be with You**. In daily posts, you can view a scripture or thought for the day. I personally vetted the sight, and I find myself drawn to the new post in my newsfeed each day. I am asking that you find it, follow it, and then share it. The second idea we found is through a bible app. Some of our church members recommended the **You Version** app to me. I liked what I found there. This app contains some helpful features like daily devotions, a bible reading plan, and a guided prayer function.

I realize not everyone is on Facebook and not everyone has a phone with apps on it, but there are many who do. In working with Lana, we talked about the need to start "somewhere." Yes, getting more church members to attend an in-person class is a worthwhile goal, but we also want to utilize some new ways of promoting Christian education and spiritual growth. Facebook and apps seemed to be a more current approach since these are ways many of us connect with information and people today. So, please do a search for **God Be With You** on Facebook and **You Version** in your app store. Set a goal to add some new forms of adult education to your daily walk. Look for the following two logos. This summer can be a time to visit some new and inspirational places.




Spotlight on Our Choir Director

The choir at Door Village UMC is a permanent fixture that has been a mainstay for many years, dating back to at least when Jo Lantz was Choir Director and a five-year-old boy was enamored with the sound of music. That five-year-old was current Director Mitch Marhanka. So, at the tender age of five, Mitch launched his strong feelings for music by beginning his first step with what would eventually be 14 years of piano lessons at the tutelage of Agnus McClellan, who was the church pianist and organist at the time, and who Mitch says was a very good piano teacher. Mitch also says that he has always felt the choir is just an integral part of the church, and he has, from the very start, enjoyed and admired all aspects of the choir. Small wonder then that he would become a part of it and eventually be director. Mitch said that in 1983 Pastor Dave Schrader asked him if he would take over for then-retiring Lesta Ribordy. He said "yes" even though he knew that would mean he'd have to commute back and forth from Valpo University where he was studying for a degree in Business – something he feels might surprise some, in that they might mistakenly think he would surely pursue a degree in music. Mitch also mentioned he has enjoyed every one of the 40 years he has been directing the choir, not only because of his love for music, but because there have always been a lot of talented members he has enjoyed working with. And in talking with several members of the choir, it quickly became obvious that the feeling is mutual because all of them said they enjoy working with Mitch, admire his ability to work with others, love his special knack for picking out exceptional songs for the choir to sing, appreciate all the work he does leading the choir, and thank him for helping them be the best they can be. ~ George Morley, Lay Leader

The Westville Lions Club has four semi trailers filled with medical equipment. The club has hospital beds, wheelchairs, walkers, and other




equipment which is loaned for free. If you have an equipment need, please call Richard Fagg at 219-733-0713.
