It's not too late to start over....

Most of us are well into our Lenten fasting. And I know it can be difficult. There are times when we fail, we let others down, and we let ourselves down. And... we let the Lord down.

One of the most powerful lessons of Lent is this: The Lord forgives us.

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

~ 1 John 1:9

So, don't give up. Don't beat yourself up. Don't despair. There is hope. In Jesus we can continue on our Lenten walk. Even after we stumble, we can get up. After a fall, we must not stay down. We can triumph after we fail. It is not too late to reform your fasting to include another area of concern. Sometimes, as we challenge ourselves, Satan creeps in yet another way. Confront sin head on. The moment you realize it or feel guilty. You know what to do. Place yourself once again at the feet of Jesus. Fall 3 times, get up 4.

Lent is more than just a time of fasting. It is also a time of adding good works to our day. So, help someone through a rough patch. Listen to someone complain. Just listen and don't try to solve their problem. And as you listen, a funny thing can happen. The person with the situation will somehow work out their own solution just by talking it through with you. Helping others is a way to honor Lent.

Another way is to send a financial blessing to others. The best thing you can do is give. Make a donation. Yes, do your good works, but not to gain God's favor. Not to gain the favor of others. Do them in a spirit of thanksgiving and praise to God.

The scripture that comes to mind here is Matthew 5:16.

In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

Easter is coming March 31st. But be sure to make the most of the Lenten journey you are on.

Pray. Fast. Sacrifice. Give.



Kids Club History & Highlights



In an effort to share some facts about the origin and long and storied history of

Kid's Club, I've gathered facts, personal comments, and guotes from those involved. I'm passing them along to you in the congregation so that you too can know about and likely appreciate even more, all the planning, coordination, and work that is done to perpetuate a program that serves the community and the church so very well.

When asked how Kid's Club got started, Cathy Dye (who was a teacher) said she had seen the need for many latchkey students to have a place to go after school until their parents could leave work and come pick them up. So, sometime in the mid-80's, the church started Kid's Club to fill that need. We offered Bible stories, sing-along songs, crafts, and snacks to kids from school and the nearby community. Right from the beginning, Cathy Dye, Carla Marhanka, and Carolyn Eyrick were there helping with many others in so many ways. They even brought the kids to church to sing for the congregation from time to time. Cathy said it was great working together.

Talking with Carolyn Eyrick a few days ago, she said her favorite part of Kid's Club is the time they share a story from the Bible each week. The goal is to plant the seeds of faith through this time together with the children. She said our Kid's Club truly appreciates the efforts of our United Women in Faith who support this program by entirely funding all the supplies, snacks, decorations, outings, and gifts to the children. Carolyn also said our team of volunteers - Pastor Sam, Carla Marhanka, Bob Wiltfong, Mary Becker, Cheryl Good, Shawntel Westphal, Bette Pointon, and several others - are amazing and so good to work with.

Talking with Carla Marhanka, one of the founding leaders of Kid's Club, she said that the program reaches and encompasses not only school children but the surrounding community. It reaches families as well as kids. She feels that the Bible stories are presented in a fun way for the kids. She also

expressed that she would like the UWF and the volunteers to know how very much they are appreciated.

Small wonder the nearly 40-year-old Kid's Club is loved and admired by those who are involved as well as others who appreciate the far-reaching and valuable efforts that are most assuredly touching the lives of these children and their families.

All I can add is *Bravo!* to such a successful legacy carried on by so many resourceful and time-generous members of our beloved church.
